JoAnn Pisel is a member of and serves as Secretary of the Board of Directors of Catholic Social Services (CSS) in a volunteer capacity. Earlier this year JoAnn was recognized by the Metro East St. Louis District of the National Association of Social Workers (NASW) with the Lifetime Achievement Award.

JoAnn has a long and accomplished career in social work here in Southern Illinois and has made a definite impact on the lives of so many people in our area.

JoAnn previously served as the Executive Director of "Call-for-Help" for 27 years during which time she was instrumental in the development of numerous programs in the area of crisis intervention. She has assembled a lifetime of accomplishments. Through her leadership efforts the following agencies were created: the *Suicide & Crisis Hotline*, a 24-hour crisis hotline; a *Centralized Information and Referral Service*, a county-wide emergency referral center; the *Women's Crisis Center* (now known as the *Violence Prevention Center*); the *Sexual Assault Victims Care Unit*; a residential transitional program for adults with mental illness; the *Youth & Teen Runaway Hotline*; a 16-bed *Youth Emergency Shelter*, for youths in crisis or at risk; an 800-Parent Hotline, for parents in crisis and in need of counseling; and a *Transitional Housing* unit to assist young women with children to seek independence in times of crisis and homelessness.

This is truly an impressive and enviable list of accomplishments, and we are proud and grateful to have JoAnn involved in our agency.

JoAnn has been on the Catholic Social Services' Board of Directors since 2003. In addition to her duties as the board secretary, as such, she is also a member of the Board Executive Committee. JoAnn also serves as the Chair of the CSS Personnel Committee. Her association with CSS actually started much earlier when she became a Foster Parent in 1984. She has fostered many children during this time. She has opened her home to children in need and embraced the opportunity to touch each child's life as a parent and positive role model. According to our Foster Care Staff, JoAnn has never turned away a child, no matter how inconvenient the schedule or the circumstances surrounding the care of that child. We have been blessed to have her as a Foster Parent for the past 24 years. **Thank you JoAnn!**

A brief summary of their accomplishments follows:

Jeanne Edgar has been a member of Our Lady Queen of Peace parish since 1976. Over the years, Jeanne has been involved in almost every activity with the church and school. Jeanne has served as lector, a Eucharistic minister, on the Pastoral Council twice and as President once. For many years she was known as the "fish fry lady" because of her leadership role in organizing all of them. She has also worked with Pastor Drew Kramer at St. Paul's United Church of Christ on the "House Build" and with the Community Interfaith Food Pantry.



Jerry Messick served on the Franklin Community Neighborhood Association Board from 2002 thru 2007. He taught after-school "life skill" classes in woodworking to fourth thru sixth graders and assisted with the annual neighborhood picnic each September. In 2005 he began work to bring various churches together in a combined food pantry effort to serve Belleville's hungry families. His tireless efforts resulted in the Community Interfaith Food Pantry which began operation in August 2007



Glenn Schott has spent his entire life working with boys and girls helping them to become responsible men and women. He has coached football teams to three championships, plus many other playoff appearances. He spent 46 years coaching and teaching in the Belleville Diocese, passing on the Christian values he lives by. His honors include: the Value and Vision Award (given for positive influence on thousands of students and athletes at Althoff Catholic High School); Illinois Football Coach Hall of Fame; Coach of the Year (St. Louis Football Coaches Association in 1980, 1989, 1990, 2002; Illinois High School All-Star Game Head Coach in 1981; and the Silver Helmet Award from St. Louis Football Cardinals (8 years).

Carbondale's "Awakenings" Program receives Illinois Bar Association Grant

Mark Hassakis, third vice-president of the Illinois Bar Association and past president of the Illinois Bar Foundation, presented an \$8,000 check to Catholic Social Services of Southern Illinois (CSS) on May 27th to be used for the Awakenings Program offered through the Carbondale CSS office.

The Awakenings program was developed by Sr. Barbara Lux, LCPC. It is a fourteen-week program to help inmates and ex-offenders examine their attitudes and behaviors. The goal is to reduce recidivism while assisting individuals develop the basic life skills needed for a more productive life. It is based upon a program developed by a group of psychologists at the prison in Taylorville, IL several years ago. With their approval, she is using this program successfully with individuals on parole or probation and with incarcerated youth.

In collaboration with Judges Charles Grace and William Schwartz, and Probation Supervisor, Ed Tolbert, the program has been offered in Jackson County since October, 2006. Fifty individuals have successfully graduated from the program. The Awakenings program has been adapted for use with juveniles at the Harrisburg Youth Facility (IYC). With the enthusiastic support of Melva Clarida, IYC Educational Facility Administrator, twelve young men graduated from the program since April, 2007.

Class topics of the Awakenings program include issues of self-esteem; respecting personal boundaries; anger management; victimization; and development of healthy relationships & lifestyles. Adult learning methods are utilized. Homework is assigned. Graduation is dependent on full participation for fourteen weeks. The goal of Awakenings is to reduce repeat offending by teaching alternate behaviors in response to stress and anger. Comments from graduates include: "I always thought I was the victim." "The class helped me to recognize how my behaviors hurt other people." "The program really helped me to learn how to control my anger."

The program was initiated in the Carbondale area with funding sources from the Gundlach Bequest, donations from individuals, churches, religious communities, and from donations at the annual Charity Breakfast. The Grant from the Illinois Bar Foundation will allow for continuation of the program in the months ahead.

The Awakenings program is a part of a regional effort to provide supportive services to those involved with the court system and/or incarceration. SIRG –Southern Illinois Reentry Group is a coalition of agencies, faith-based organizations and concerned citizens who have joined together to coordinate services to reduce recidivism and successfully reintegrate the offender into the community.

Did You Know?

Catholic Social Services of Southern Illinois is one of the largest providers of Foster Care Services in Southern Illinois. Through three of our locations (Belleville, Carbondale, and Mt. Vernon) we currently provide services to 447 foster children (393 traditional cases, and 54 specialized/treatment cases).

Counseling Questions

Here are the top three questions we get from callers.

1. What kind of Counseling do you offer?
2. How much does it cost, and do you take insurance?
3. How soon can I come in?

Here are the answers to those questions.

1. We offer individual, couple, and family counseling and provide an number of different clinical modalities for our clients.
2. We accept most major insurances. We bill at a rate of \$85.00 per session (with one session being 50-60 minutes long). If a prospective client has financial issues or is not insured, we do utilize an adjusted fee scale based upon the income of the household. We may adjust the payment as low as \$25.00 depending upon individual circumstances.
3. We are able to work in new patients within a 2 week period. In cases of severe emergency, we do our utmost to assist the client as soon as possible.
