SCSEP is funded by a \$45.2 million grant from the U.S. Department of Labor. This funding provides 90% of the support for SCSEP with The Center providing 10% match or \$5 million. The SCSEP Program is an equal opportunity program. Auxiliary aids and services are available upon request to individuals with disabilities.

Caritas Family Solutions SCSEP Celebrates Older Americans Month!

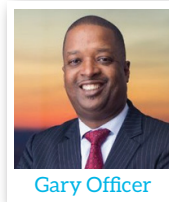


Every May, Center for Workforce Inclusion, Inc. (CWI), is one of our nation's leaders in the observance of Older Americans Month (OAM).

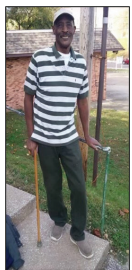

Mr. George joined the SCSEP in 2007.

Although each participant only has four years, there is no limit as to how many times you can exit the program for unsubsidized employment, and re-enroll into the program. Mr. George would get a job, work as

long as the position lasted... and re-enroll back into SCSEP — having done this at least six (6) times!
